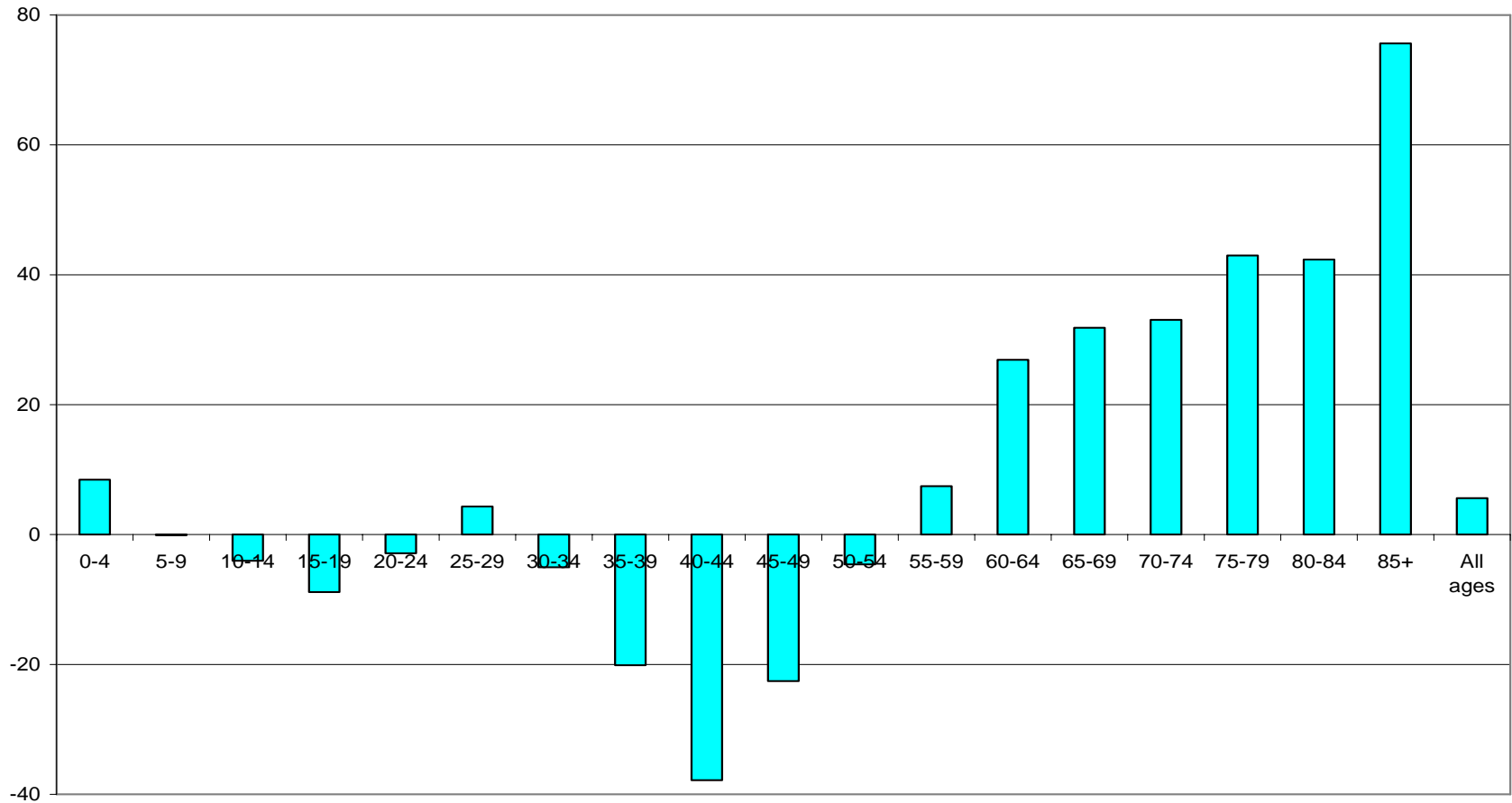
Overall Picture for Lewes

- Current population is 95,200 - 99,185 people by 2026 – additional 2,000 people compared to previous projections.
- 52.2% of the population are women.
- Currently 22.5% of people are above retirement age.
- Generally older people are more satisfied with their local area/home as a place to live.
- Older people less likely to want to be involved in decision-making (18% compared to 27%)

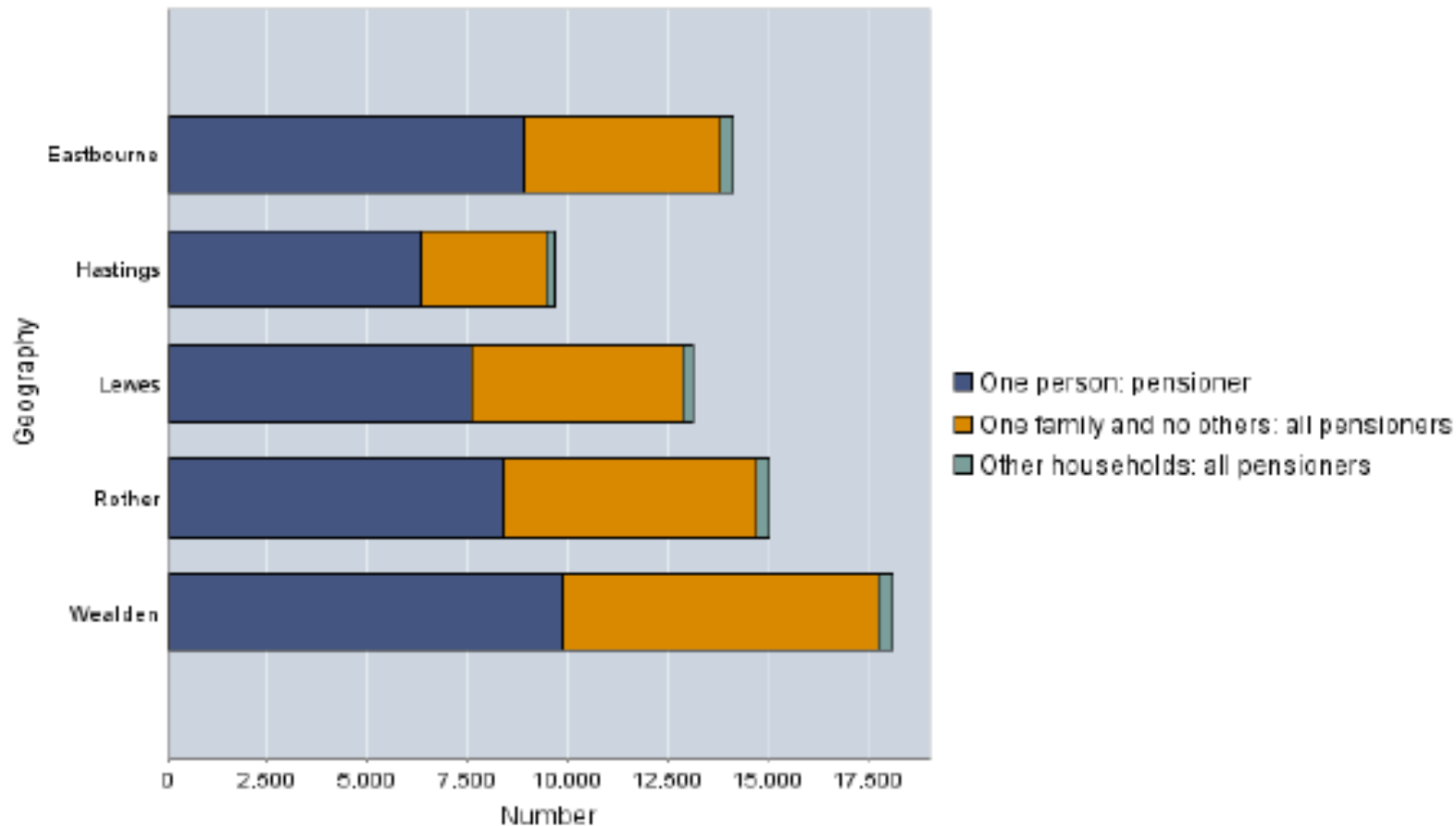

Decent, Affordable Housing

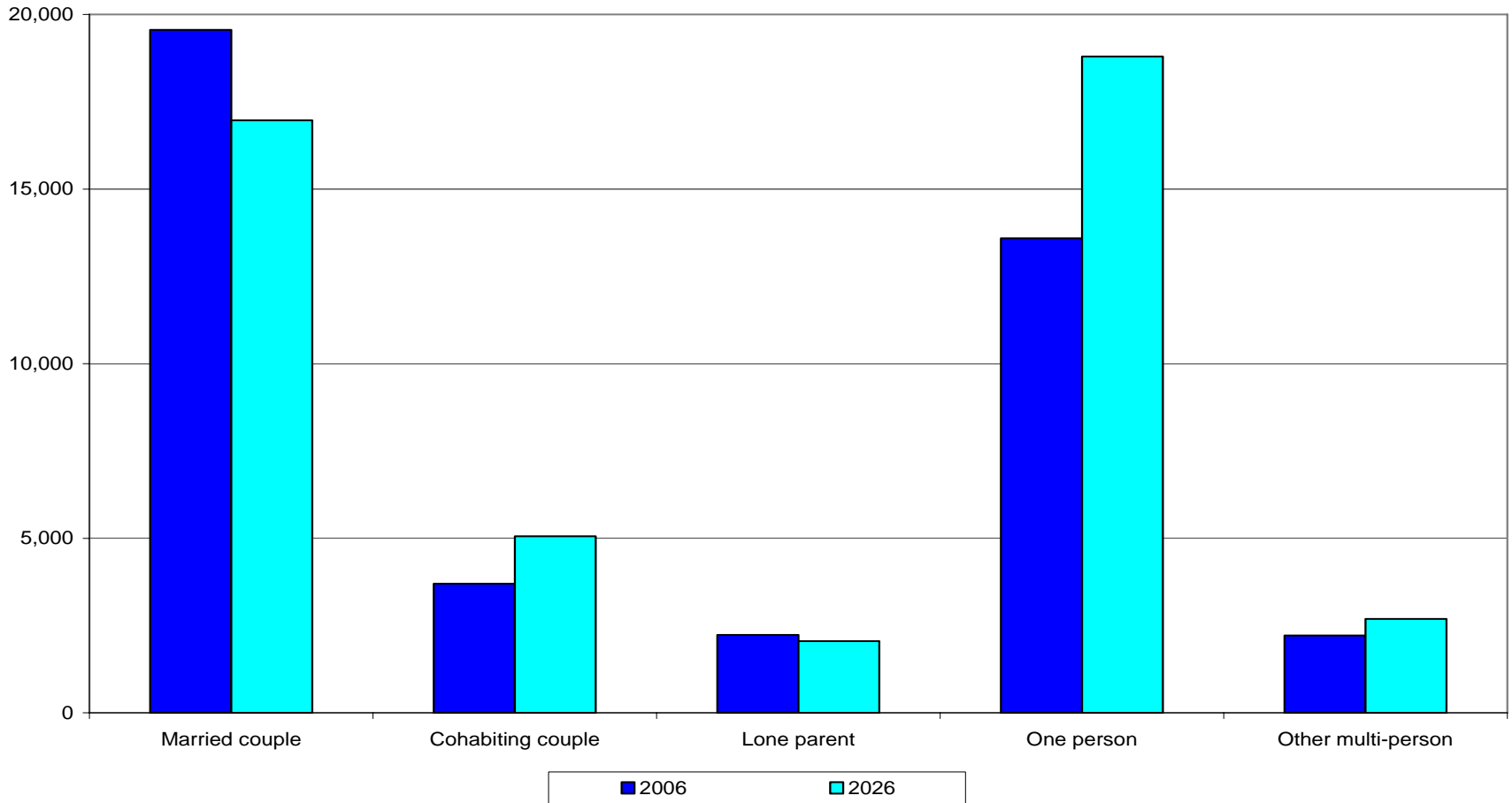
- **Satisfaction of over 65s with home and neighbourhood (N1138) is high**
 - *Slightly under nine out of ten over 65s (88%) are satisfied with both their local area and their home. Similar to East Sussex as a whole (86%).*



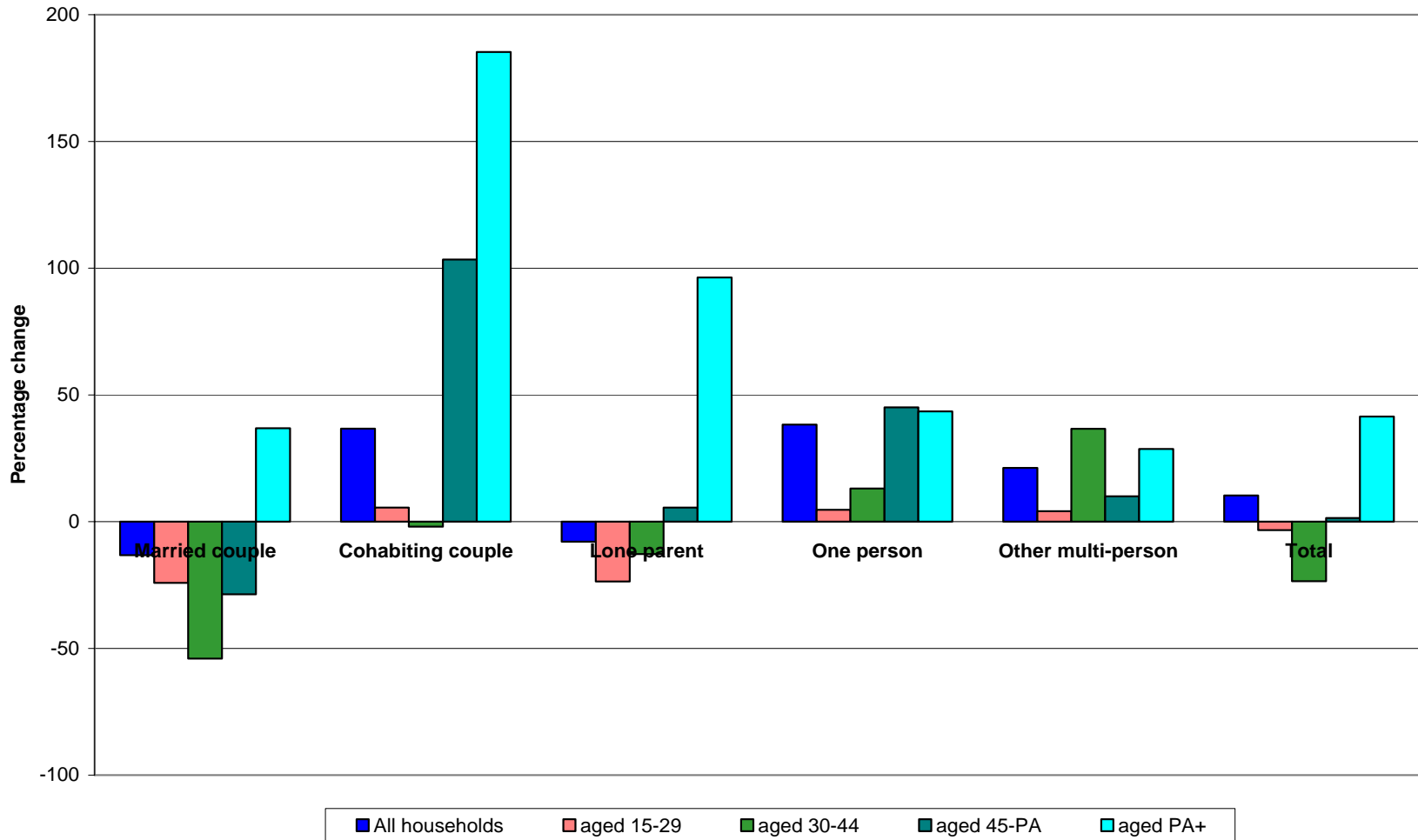
Growth in older households

- As in previous projections, population growth is mainly amongst the older age groups aged 55+
- Households with a “head” over pensionable age are projected to increase by 41% by 2026
- One person households projected to increase by over a third by 2026, and many of these are in older age groups

Household change by type and age, Lewes, 2006-26



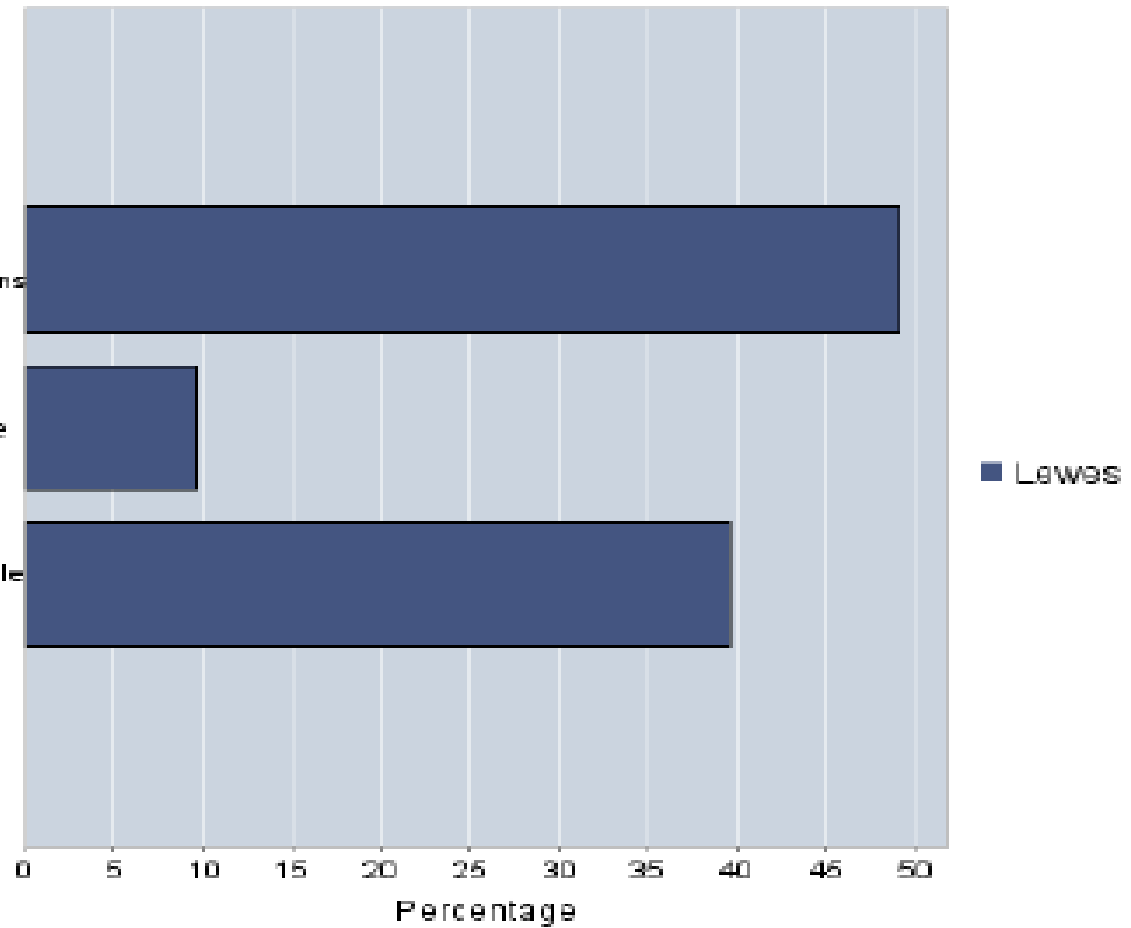

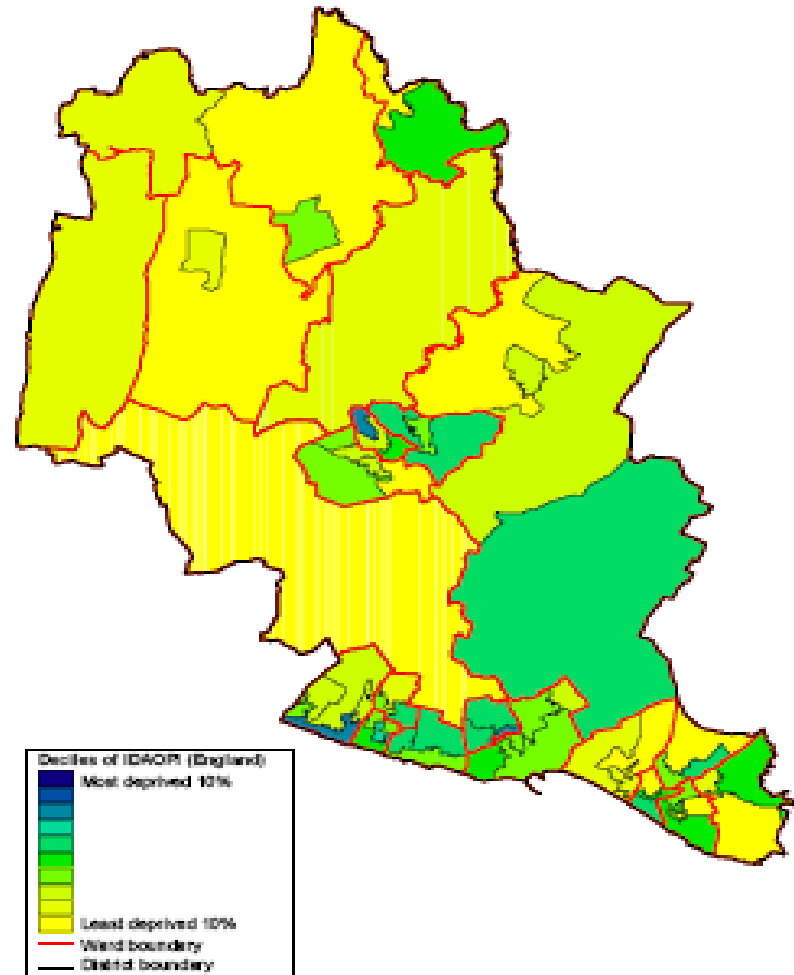

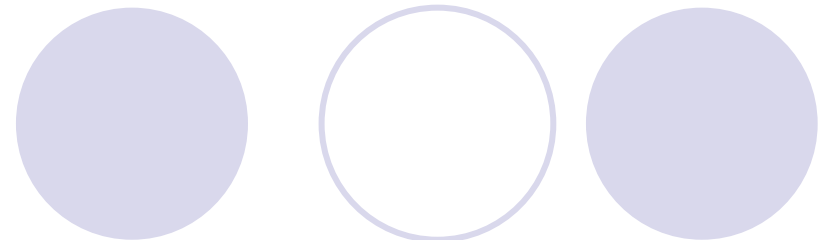

- Over 65s felt road and pavement repairs were more in need of improvement compared to rest of population
- Bus services were used significantly more by older people (62% compared to 50%)

Environment/Good Local Facilities

- Over 65s felt road and pavement repairs were more in need of improvement compared to rest of population
- Over 65s rated public transport, road and pavement repairs and cultural facilities as more important compared to the general population
- Generally older people are around 10% more satisfied with local public services, their GP, hospital and dentist compared to rest of the population
